


# RFC Overview Map

## Rail Freight Corridor Access

### Corridor OSS/RFC Product & Service Portfolio

In order to make network access as simple as possible the RFC created a single contact point to the customers - the Corridor OSS.

#### Corridor OSS (One-Stop-Shop)

The RFC OSS is a single point of contact for applicants who provides general information related to the RFC access and receives and answers path requests involving pre-arranged paths. It allocates pre-arranged paths within the annual timetable and within remaining capacity.

The Corridor OSS provides the following Product and Service Portfolio:

#### Pre-arranged paths (Paps)

##### Instant capacity for the RFC usage

Can be requested via a single point of contact, the Corridor OSS

- » Are available in PCS prior to ordering
- » Ensure a relatively high priority in case of conflict with other path requests
- » Are protected against other paths up to two month before train run

#### Corridor Information Document (CID)

##### A "user manual" for the RFC including

- » all the information in relation with the freight corridor contained in the national network statements
- » information on terminals, on capacity allocation (OSS operation) and traffic management
- » the RFC implementation plan
